Understanding the Story

Beyond the Book

1. Stress the idea of the importance of each person's contributions; that process is sometimes as important as the end result.

- 2. Ask your child to think of something he/she has helped to do or make.
- 3. Discuss the difference between participating in the process and having something done or made for you.
