"MUSART" WITH MS. DREYFUSS AND MRS. CLOSSON

What happens when you blend art and music into one unique classroom experience? A joyous mix of sound, movement, and creativity result! ECDC Atelierista, Mrs. Dreyfuss and Music Educator, Mrs. Closson wondered what would happen if we explored a wide sample of music genres and styles - fast, slow, agitated, sleepy, and even silly - and let the music travel down through our arms, hands, bellies, legs and feet to explore gross motor movements together. We then took that creative inspiration with us to the art room where the music became more "colorful" movement, traveling from our ears and down our arms through a mix of crayons to joyously put our ideas to paper and give special attention to our fine motor skills. As we discovered, if your crayon is dancing across the paper to the music, then your body is probably wiggling right along with it! We laughed, and danced, and learned together as the music came to life right before our eyes.
